Repeated Words, Themes, and Ideas

- 1. <u>Sinners / sin</u>, if you're walking by the Spirit and you see someone walking in sin, you're supposed to help restore them while being careful not to be tempted by sin yourself, 6:1 (other places this appears: 2:15, 17, 18; 3:19, 22).
- 2. <u>Living life by the Spirit/Faith vs. Living life by the Flesh/Works</u>, the one living by the Spirit is supposed to help the one walking by the flesh, 6:1. Paul wishes peace and mercy on everyone who walks according to their new creation in Christ, 6:16 (other places this appears: 2:19, 20; 3:2, 3, 5, 10, 11, 12; 4:23-31; 5:16-23, 24, 25-26).
- 3. <u>Gentleness</u>, the one walking by the Spirit, who will help the one walking in sin, is to do it in a spirit of gentleness, 6:1 (other places this appears: 5:23).
- 4. <u>Love / serve one another</u>, if we see someone struggling for any reason, we're to help them bear that burden, 6:2 (other places this appears: 5:6, 13, 14).
- 5. <u>Bear</u>, we're to help bear each other's burdens, 6:2. Each one of us is responsible to bear his/her own load, 6:5. Paul bore scars on his body from serving the Lord Jesus Christ, 6:17.
- 6. <u>Jesus Christ / Lord</u>, in order to fulfill the law of Christ, we must be Christ-like and bear each other's burdens, 6:2. The legalists wanted to circumcise the Galatians so that they wouldn't suffer persecution for siding with the Cross of Christ (which didn't demand circumcision), 6:12. Paul refused to boast in anything other than the Cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, 6:14. The only thing that matters for those of us who are in Christ Jesus is that we are a new creation in Christ, 6:15. Paul bore on his body the scars from serving the Lord Jesus, 6:17. Paul wants the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ to be with the spirit of each Galatian, 6:18 (other places this appears: 1:1, 3, 4, 6, 7, 12, 16, 19, 22; 2:4, 16, 17, 20, 21; 3:1, 13, 14, 16, 17, 22, 24, 26, 27, 28, 29; 4:4, 6, 7, 14, 19; 5:1, 2, 4, 6, 10, 24).
- 7. Conceit / Boast, to think that you're something special when you're not, is to deceive yourself, 6:3. In order to avoid conceit, you have to resist comparing yourself to others and instead judge yourself against the best you possible, 6:4. The circumcised legalists wanted the Galatians to get circumcised so that they could boast in their circumcised flesh, 6:13. Paul refused to boast in anything other than the Cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, 6:14 (other places this appears: 5:26).
- 8. <u>Deceive</u>, to think that you're more than you really are, is self-deception, 6:3. We must not deceive ourselves; God will not be mocked; whatever we sow, we will reap, 6:7.
- 9. <u>Scripture</u>, the one who is taught the Word should share all his good things with the one who teaches him, 6:6 (other places this appears: 3:8, 22).
- 10. <u>God the Father</u>, God won't be mocked; we will reap what we sow, 6:7. Paul is so adamant that he invokes God to prevent him from boasting in anything except the Cross of Christ, 6:14. Paul wishes peace and mercy on those who walk according to their new nature in Christ and on the Israel of God, 6:16 (other places this appears: 1:1, 3, 4-5, 6, 10, 13, 15-16, 20; 2:6, 19, 20, 21; 3:6, 8, 11, 17, 18, 20, 21, 26; 4:6, 7, 8, 9, 14; 5:8).

- 11. <u>Sow / Reap</u>, whatever a person sows, that he will also reap, 6:7. The one who sows to his flesh will of his flesh reap corruption, but the one who shows to the Spirit will of the Spirit reap everlasting life, 6:8. We must not give up while doing good, for in due season we will reap if we don't lose heart, 6:9 (other places this appears: 5:19-26).
- 12. Flesh (human/physical) / Flesh (sin nature), the one who sows by his sinful nature will by that sinful nature reap corruption, 6:8. Those who wanted to boast in the flesh of circumcision did it so that they wouldn't suffer persecution for siding with the Cross of Christ (which didn't require circumcision), 6:12. The legalists who wanted the Galatians circumcised did it to boast about the Galatians' circumcised flesh, 6:13 (other places this appears: 1:16; 2:16, 20; 3:3; 4:14; 5:13).
- 13. <u>Faith/Believe</u>, we are obligated to do good to all, especially those of the Christian faith, 6:10 (other places this appears: 1:23; 2:16, 20; 3:2, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 11, 12, 14, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26; 5:4-5, 6).
- 14. <u>Circumcised/Uncircumcised / Circumcision/Uncircumcision</u>, the legalists compelled the Galatians to get circumcised so that they would not have to undergo persecution for serving the Cross of Christ, 6:12. The circumcised legalists wanted the Galatians to get circumcised so that they could boast in the Galatians' circumcised flesh, 6:13. For those who are in Christ Jesus being circumcised or not gains you nothing, 6:15 (other places this appears: 2:3, 7, 8, 9, 12; 5:2, 3, 6, 11, 12).
- 15. <u>Suffering persecution for the Cross of Christ</u>, the legalists wanted the Galatians to get circumcised so that they wouldn't suffer persecution for siding with the Cross of Christ (which didn't require circumcision), 6:12. Paul bore on his body the scars he got from serving the Lord Jesus, 6:17 (other places this appears: 5:11).
- 16. <u>Law</u>, the circumcised legalists were hypocrites; they didn't keep the Law themselves, 6:13 (other places this appears: 2:16, 19, 21; 3:12, 13, 17, 18, 19, 21, 23, 24; 4:4, 5, 10, 12, 21-31; 5:3, 4, 14, 22-23).
- 17. World, through the Cross of Christ, the world no longer had a hold on Paul; he was dead to the world, 6:14 (other places this appears: 4:3).
- 18. <u>Crucified</u>, the Cross of Christ freed Paul from the world, i.e., the world had been crucified to Paul and Paul to the world, 6:14 (other places this appears: 2:20; 3:1; 5:24).
- 19. <u>New creation</u>, whether you're circumcised or not gains you nothing; what matters is that you're a new creation in Christ Jesus, 6:15 (other places this appears: 4:5-7; 5:16-26).
- 20. <u>Peace</u>, Paul wishes peace on those who walk according to their new nature in Christ and on the Israel of God, 6:16 (other places this appears: 1:3).
- 21. <u>Grace</u>, Paul wants the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ to be with the spirit of each Galatian, 6:18 (other places this appears: 1:3, 6, 15; 2:9, 21; 5:4).
