

Repeated Words, Themes, and Ideas

1. God's Faith/Truth/Word/Doctrine, Titus must speak the proper things necessary for sound [healthy/error-free] doctrine, 2:1. The purpose for Titus speaking the proper things necessary for error-free doctrine is so that the older men will be healthy/error-free in the faith, 2:2. The reason the older women must show the young women how to be godly wives and mothers is so that the Word of God may not be blasphemed, 2:5. Titus must be an example of good works in his doctrine, i.e., his doctrine must be full of integrity, holiness, and incorruptibility, 2:7. Titus' speech [his doctrine] must be error-free, beyond reproach so that his opponents will be ashamed when they speak evil of him, 2:8. Slaves must exhibit godly behavior towards their masters so that they may adorn the doctrine of God our Savior in all things, 2:9-10. Titus must speak healthy/error-free doctrine, exhort, and rebuke with all authority while letting no one despise him, 2:15 (other places this appears: 1:1, 2-3, 4, 5-6, 9, 10-13, 10-14).
2. Not abusing alcohol, Titus must speak the proper things necessary for healthy/error-free doctrine so that the older men will not abuse alcohol, 2:1-2. Titus must speak the proper things necessary for healthy/error-free doctrine so that the older women will exhibit godly behavior including not abusing wine, 2:3 (other places this appears: 1:7).
3. Godly and Blameless behavior, Titus must speak the proper things necessary for healthy/error-free doctrine so that the older men will exhibit godly behavior, 2:1-2. Titus must speak the proper things necessary for healthy/error-free doctrine so that the older women will exhibit godly behavior including teaching young women to exhibit godly behavior as wives and mothers, that the Word of God may not be blasphemed, 2:1, 3-5. Titus must exhort the young men to be in complete control of themselves, 2:6. Titus must be an example of godly behavior in all things; his doctrine must be incorruptible, full of integrity, and beyond reproach so that his opponents will be ashamed when they speak evil of him, 2:7-8. Titus must exhort slaves to willingly submit to their masters, to serve them well in all things, to not speak against them, to not embezzle, but be trustworthy so that they will adorn the doctrine of God our Savior in all things, 2:9-10. God's grace which brings salvation has appeared to all men, teaching us to deny ungodliness and worldly lusts and instead live soberly, righteously, and godly in the present age, 2:11-12. Jesus died for us so that He might redeem us from every ungodly behavior and purify for Himself His own special people who are zealous for godly behavior, 2:14 (other places this appears: 1:1, 6-9, 15).
4. Ungodly and Reproachable behavior, Titus must speak the proper things necessary for healthy/error-free doctrine so that the older women will not be slanderers or abuse wine, 2:1, 3. Jesus died so that He might redeem us from every ungodly behavior, 2:14. Titus must speak healthy/error-free doctrine, exhort, and rebuke with all authority [the ungodly behavior of the Cretans], not allowing anyone to despise him, 2:15 (other places this appears: 1:5, 10-16, 9, 10-12, 10-14, 15, 16).
5. Good/Godly Works, the older women must exhibit godly behavior including teaching good/godly works to young women, 2:3-5. Titus must be an example of godly works in all things, 2:7. Jesus willingly died for us so that He might redeem us from every lawless deed and purify for Himself His own special people who are zealous for godly works, 2:14 (other places this appears: 1:8, 16).

6. God, older women must admonish the young women to be godly wives and mothers so that the Word of God may not be blasphemed, 2:4-5. Slaves must not embezzle but be trustworthy so that they may adorn the doctrine of God our Savior in all things, 2:10. God's grace, which brings salvation, has appeared to all men, 2:11. We should deny ungodliness and worldly lusts and instead live soberly, righteously, and godly in the present age, as we look for the blessed hope and glorious appearing of our great God and Savior Jesus Christ, 2:13 (other places this appears: 1:1, 2, 2-3, 4, 7, 15-16).
7. Man's False-Truth/Commandments, Titus must speak God's truth, exhort, and rebuke with all authority [the false-truth and commandments of men] while letting no one despise him, 2:15 (other places this appears: 1:10-11, 14).
8. Savior, slaves must not embezzle but instead be trustworthy so that they will adorn the doctrine of God our Savior in all things, 2:10. We should deny ungodliness and worldly lusts and live soberly, righteously, and godly in the present age as we look for the blessed hope and glorious appearing of our great God and Savior Jesus Christ, 2:12-13 (other places this appears: 1:2-3, 4).
9. Jesus, we should look for the blessed hope and glorious appearing of our great God and Savior Jesus Christ, 2:13. Jesus willingly died for us so that He might redeem us from every lawless deed and purify for Himself His own special people, zealous for good works, 2:14 (other places this appears: 1:1, 4).
10. Exhort and Convict/Rebuke to produce godly behavior, Titus must speak God's truth, exhort, and rebuke with all authority [the false-truth and commandments of men] while letting no one despise him [in order to produce godly behavior in the Cretans], 2:15 (other places this appears: 1:9, 10-14).
